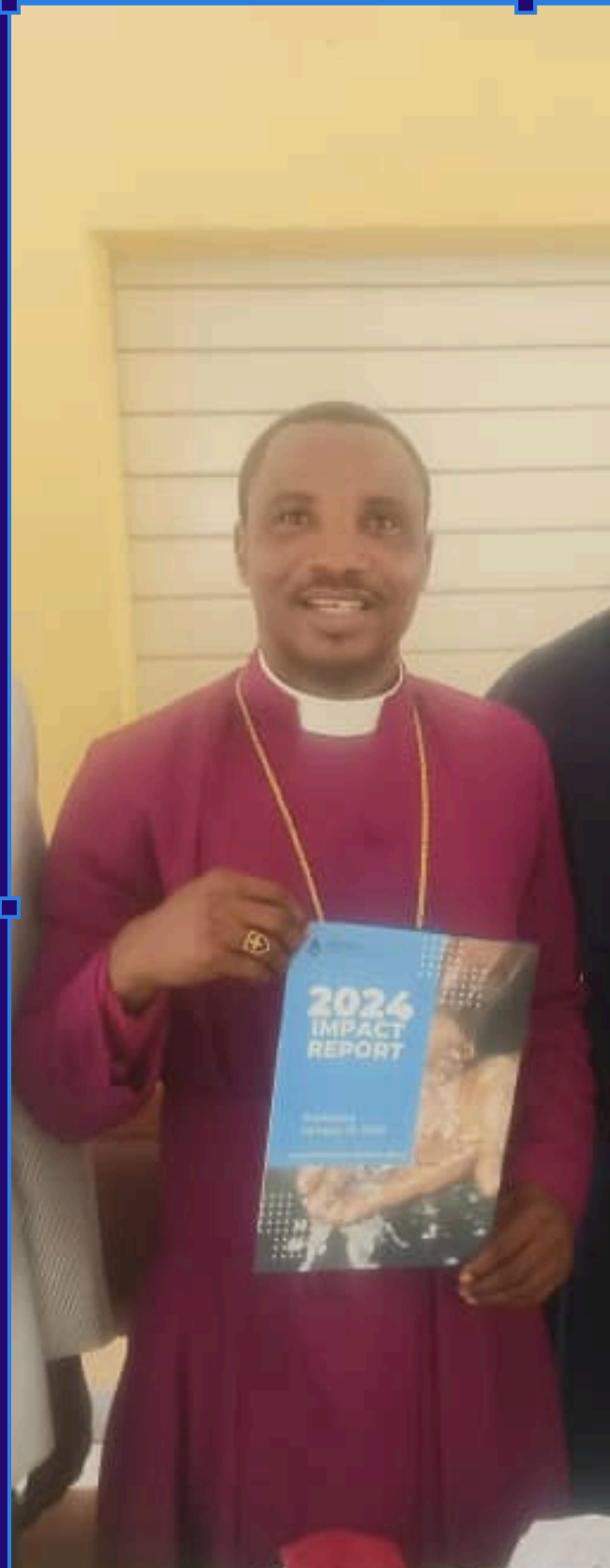

The success of the program serves as a testament to the dedication of Christian leaders and organizations in promoting accountability, community service, and faith-based advocacy.

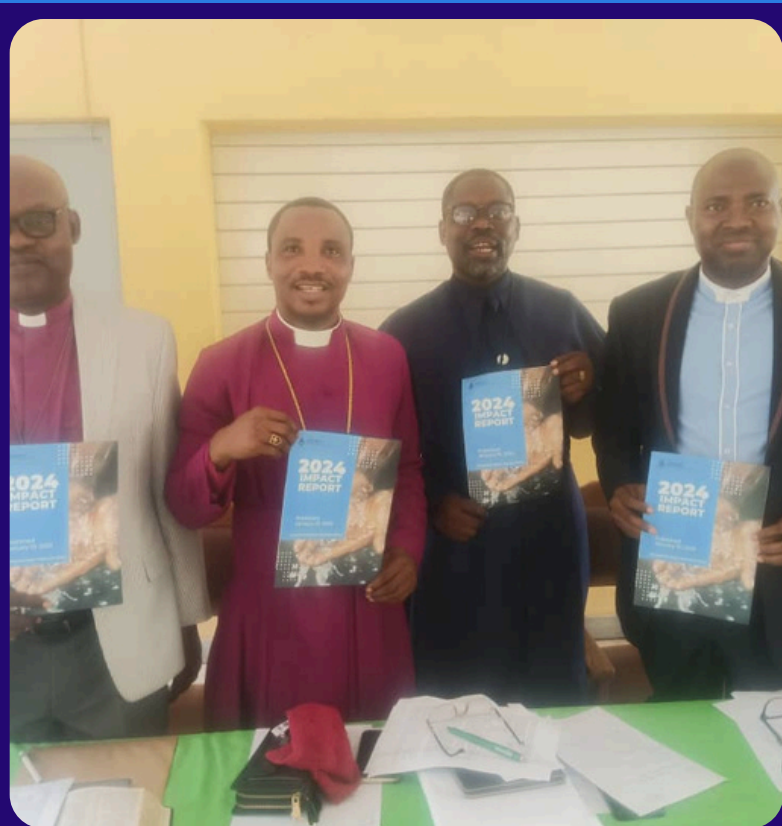

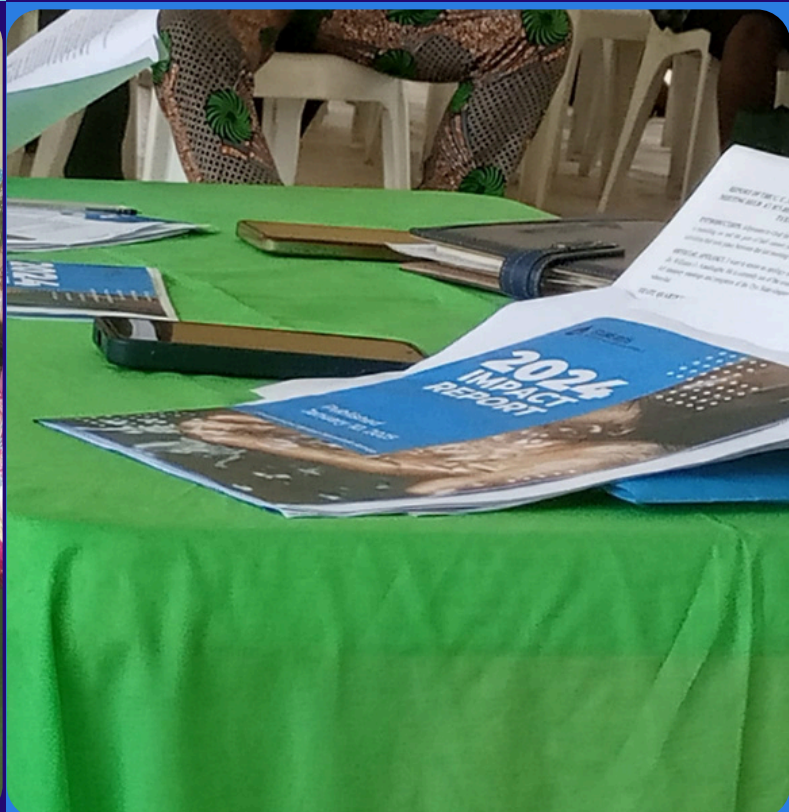
